cost<sup>r</sup>s = coster, a hanging for a bed, the walls of a room etc.

tube = tub.

quishings = cushions

mand = maund, a wicker or woven basket, having a handle/s

bedstox = bedstocks, bedsteads, especially their front and back parts.

rekon = iron bar or hook in the chimney to suspend pots over fire

chafing dish = a dish to hold burning fuel for heating anything placed upon it.

piggeon = small pail or tub

flascitt = flasket, a long, shallow basket

trencors = trenchers, wooden plates

coupe = a cart or waggon with closed sides for dung etc.

stees = ladders

wrathes = the shafts of a cart

a 3 grande fork = a three pronged fork
