The inventory of all the goods & chattels moneyes & credits late belonging to James Green Senior of Salterforth in the parish of Barnoldswick in the county of Yorke deceased. Apprised according to the discretion of William Bracewell John Hartley Robert Jackson & Henry Taylor the 18 day of May Anno Domini 1713

Imprs his purse & apparrell, £9 8s; one longsetle, 2s; one bible, 5s; one chist in the house 2s; one litle table in the house, 1s; three shelves in the house, 1s; one chimney reckon tongues & briggs, 4s; two chists in the parlor, 13s 4d; one bed & bedding in the parlor, £1 6s; two chists in the parlor, 1s; one pair of old boots, 1s 6d; one warping wough & rings 2s 6d; three bedsteads in the house chamber, 4s; one ark in the house chamber, 2s 6d; one weighbalk scales & ridle, 9d; dishboard & shelves & other things in milkhouse, 2s 6d; one spinning wheel, 6d; three chaires, 2s; one cheeseprass one dishboard and all other huslement belonging to the house, 3s 6d; oweing to the deceased by John Sutcliffe, £5. The total: £18 3s 1d.
